Detailed Reviewer's Report

- Dentin hypersensitivity is a common dental condition characterized by short, sharp, and intense pain triggered by hot, cold, acidic, or sweet stimuli, as well as tooth brushing. It is caused by exposed, open dentinal tubules resulting from gum recession or enamel loss. Treatments include desensitizing toothpaste, fluoride, and professional treatments.**
- Tooth sensitivity, also known as dentin hypersensitivity, is a common dental problem characterized by sharp, temporary pain or discomfort in one or more teeth when exposed to certain stimuli. These stimuli can include hot or cold temperatures, sweet or acidic foods and drinks, or even brushing and flossing.**
