Detailed Reviewer’s Report

The manuscript titled RELIGION, TOURISM AND DEVELOPMENT signifies a relevant side in today’s time which raises an important aspect for the policy makers to ponder upon.

The manuscript is well written and discussed, significant case studies have been analyzed and studied which provide comprehensive understanding of the manuscript and is easy to understand given the clarity and flow of the author.

However, for future references there are some technical aspects that the author should reflect over while writing any further manuscript:

- 1. Literature review does not just reflect what that particular literature has discussed that to in just 2-3 lines but it is your review to the literature. So, it also includes analyzing it, finding the gap, and reading over to add your insights to topic as well. Also, the literature review should not look like that you have just taken over few significant lines from the literature or verbatim.*
- 2. The conclusion should be concluding analysis or it could summarize the whole paper and not just a part of it. For instance, you have given significant portion of your conclusion to Indian context and then summarized your research objectives and hypothesis in last 3-4 lines. The conclusion could have discussed the tittle and the manuscript more comprehensively.*
- 3. The first line under the heading ‘discussion’- “After research investigations, it was found that religion is not separated from African development (Golo &Novieto,2022”, Africa was not discussed under case studies and therefore a sudden mention of Africa would take any reader a step back. Either give context to it or do not add. It makes it look like it has been added for including a citation.*
- 4. The paper is well written yet there are some suggestions to how this paper can be studied from different aspects: If the paper was just India focused, it would have provided more depth to the research. If the paper was both India and abroad, a comparative analysis could have also been done. If the paper included both India and abroad (like in this paper) then it could have included case studies from all over the world and few more could have been taken from India then there was no specific need to add that this paper discusses both India and abroad. Given your area,*

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yes, India does have significant number of case studies so it is important to mention and thus your research paper has significant case studies included.

- 5. A more specific title could be framed, titles with less specific nature tend to have wider area and short papers do not justify it completely. It leaves a lot of space to work on and provide less depth.*
