**Reviewer's Comment for Publication.**

The manuscript provides a highly relevant and intellectually rigorous examination of the evolving challenges posed by artificial intelligence to intellectual property law. The paper effectively captures the "AI paradox" by highlighting the tension between innovation and legal protection, particularly in the domains of copyright and trademark law. The comparative analysis across India, the United States, and the European Union adds substantial depth and enhances the global relevance of the study.

The discussion on emerging doctrines such as prompt engineering, de minimis use in AI training, and the "right to be un-trained" is especially insightful and reflects strong engagement with recent legal developments. The integration of case law and statutory frameworks strengthens the analytical foundation, while the proposed hybrid regulatory approach is both practical and forward-looking.

However, a few minor revisions are recommended:

1. Some sections would benefit from improved grammatical consistency and sentence clarity, particularly in densely analytical paragraphs.
2. The manuscript should ensure uniform citation formatting in endnotes.
3. A brief methodology or research approach clarification (doctrinal, comparative, analytical) may enhance academic rigor.
4. Certain arguments, especially on "style protection" and "human-to-AI contribution ratios," could be slightly elaborated for greater conceptual clarity.

Overall, the paper makes a significant scholarly contribution to contemporary IP law discourse and is suitable for publication after minor revisions.
