- 1. Impaction typically refers to fecal impaction, a severe medical condition where an immobile mass of hard, dry stool gets stuck in the rectum or lower colon. It generally stems from unmanaged chronic constipation and requires prompt medical attention to avoid serious complications.**

6. Restoring the esthetic focal point—typically the maxillary central incisors and the surrounding gingival contours—requires precise alignment of facial symmetry, geometric proportions, and occlusal harmony. The goal is to achieve a natural, youthful, and balanced smile.
7. Orthodontic management involves diagnosing and correcting jaw irregularities and tooth misalignment (malocclusion) using customized appliances like braces or clear aligners. Treatment spans multiple phases—from the initial diagnostic evaluation and active movement to post-treatment retention—ensuring a healthy, functional, and aesthetic bite.

An impacted maxillary central incisor is a tooth that fails to erupt into the dental arch by the expected age, often causing aesthetic and functional issues, occurring in roughly $(0.03\%-1\%)$ of the population. It is usually caused by supernumerary teeth, crowding, or trauma to baby teeth. Management requires a multidisciplinary approach, including surgical exposure and orthodontic traction to guide the tooth into its proper position.
