### *Detailed Reviewer's Report*

The paper titled “*Uncovering Research Patterns in Agripreneurship: A Bibliometric Analysis*” presents a systematic and insightful examination of the evolution of agripreneurship research from 1992 to 2026. The study successfully highlights how agripreneurship has transformed from a relatively unexplored concept into an emerging interdisciplinary field associated with rural development, sustainability, entrepreneurship, and food security. By employing bibliometric tools such as Biblioshiny and VOSviewer, the researchers provide a quantitative overview of publication trends, influential authors, leading journals, and thematic developments in the field. The paper demonstrates strong academic relevance because agripreneurship has become increasingly important in addressing rural unemployment, poverty reduction, and agricultural modernization. One of the major strengths of the study lies in its clear methodological framework. The researchers used the Scopus database and analyzed 426 documents across 160 sources, ensuring a broad and reliable data set for bibliometric evaluation. The inclusion of multiple keywords such as “agripreneurship,” “agricultural entrepreneurship,” and “farm entrepreneurship” enhanced the comprehensiveness of the search strategy. Furthermore, the use of visualization tools like Biblioshiny and VOSviewer enabled the authors to effectively interpret intellectual structures, thematic clusters, and collaboration networks within the research domain.

The paper effectively explains the growth trajectory of agripreneurship research. The analysis reveals that publication output remained limited during the early years but expanded rapidly after 2016, reflecting increasing scholarly and policy interest in entrepreneurship-driven agricultural transformation. The discussion regarding the rise of sustainability-oriented agriculture, digital innovation, food security, and youth entrepreneurship demonstrates the dynamic nature of the field. The identification of India, China, and the United States as major contributors further strengthens the global perspective of the study. Another notable contribution of the paper is its thematic analysis. The keyword co-occurrence network and trend topic analysis reveal that agripreneurship research is highly multidisciplinary, integrating concepts from entrepreneurship, agricultural economics, sustainability studies, rural sociology, and development studies. Themes such as sustainable development, agribusiness, entrepreneurial intention, food security, agricultural technology, and rural entrepreneurship are carefully interpreted and linked to broader socio-economic goals. The paper also highlights the growing importance of technological innovation and smart agriculture in recent agripreneurship research.

The study also makes a valuable contribution by identifying influential authors, journals, and highly cited documents within the field. The discussion on intellectual concentration and collaborative scholarship provides useful insights into how agripreneurship research is being shaped academically. The authors successfully show that the field is gradually attaining intellectual maturity through interconnected research networks and interdisciplinary collaborations.

Despite its strengths, the paper has a few limitations. The study relies solely on the Scopus database, which may exclude relevant publications indexed in Web of Science, Google Scholar, or regional databases. The paper also focuses primarily on quantitative bibliometric indicators and gives limited attention to qualitative interpretation of individual studies. Additionally, while the research identifies emerging themes such as artificial intelligence and digital agriculture, it could have provided deeper discussion on future research directions and practical policy implications for developing economies.

Overall, the paper is a well-structured and informative bibliometric study that significantly contributes to understanding the intellectual and thematic evolution of agripreneurship research. It successfully establishes agripreneurship as a rapidly expanding and policy-relevant academic field closely linked with sustainability, innovation, and rural transformation. The study will be highly useful for researchers, policymakers, agricultural entrepreneurs, and students seeking a comprehensive overview of agripreneurship scholarship and its future potential.
