### Detailed Reviewer's Report

#### Strength of the study:

- The study presents a rare and clinically important pediatric emergency case with strong practical relevance
- The case is described in a clear chronological manner from presentation to outcome
- Clinical findings, ICU course, imaging, and complications are well documented
- The discussion is informative and supported by relevant references
- The report highlights the importance of early recognition, emergency management, and prevention in young children

#### Weakness of the study:

- The manuscript is based on a single case, which limits generalization of findings
- Some sections of the discussion are longer than necessary and may be shortened
- Minor grammatical and sentence-level corrections are needed for better readability
- More details on consent and ethical approval should be clearly stated in the manuscript
- A brief summary of lessons learned for clinicians could strengthen the conclusion further

#### Reviewers Comments:

This manuscript presents a serious and clinically meaningful case of acute foreign body aspiration in an infant complicated by cardiorespiratory arrest and multiple systemic complications. The topic is highly relevant in pediatric emergency and intensive care practice because aspiration remains a preventable cause of morbidity and mortality in young children. The case is presented clearly with good detail regarding initial presentation, management, complications, and clinical progression. The discussion is comprehensive and connects the case well with existing literature. The manuscript also strongly highlights the importance of prevention and parental awareness. The writing quality is generally good and understandable, though minor grammatical editing would improve overall readability and flow. Ethical considerations are important in case reports, and the authors should ensure that ethical clearance or informed parental consent is clearly mentioned in the final version. The main limitation is that it is a single case report, which naturally limits broader conclusions. Overall, this is a valuable and informative manuscript suitable for publication after minor revision.
