Strength:

1. Clinically relevant and timely review topic.

3. Well-structured and easy to understand.

6. Highlights the need for integrative management.

Weakness:

1. Narrative review lacks systematic methodology.
2. Limited critical comparison between modern and Ayurvedic evidence.
3. More high-quality clinical studies should be included.
4. Some Ayurvedic treatment recommendations need stronger scientific support.
5. Minor language and formatting corrections are required.
6. Future research directions could be discussed in greater detail.

Overall assessment:

The manuscript provides a well-organized and informative overview of allergic eye diseases by integrating modern ophthalmology with Ayurvedic principles. The topic is relevant and clinically valuable. However, the review would benefit from a more systematic methodology, stronger evidence-

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based discussion, inclusion of additional high-quality clinical studies, and minor language and formatting revisions.
