Detailed Reviewer's Report

1. The title is comprehensive but excessively long. Consider shortening it to improve readability and better reflect the primary focus of the review.
2. The structured abstract is well organized and clearly written. The objective and methods are appropriate for an integrative review.
3. The manuscript provides a good overview of the epidemiology, pathophysiology, diagnosis, and contemporary management of primary hyperhidrosis.
4. The manuscript is well written and provides a comprehensive overview of the subject. Minor revisions aimed at improving methodological transparency and maintaining a balanced interpretation of the available evidence would enhance its scientific quality.
5. The section on constitutional homoeopathy should more explicitly acknowledge the limited availability of high-quality clinical evidence. Claims regarding therapeutic effectiveness should be presented cautiously and supported by appropriate references.
6. The manuscript addresses a clinically relevant topic and provides a comprehensive integrative review. It is suitable for publication after minor revisions addressing the methodological description, balanced presentation of evidence, and clearer distinction between evidence-based medicine and theoretical homoeopathic concepts.
