Detailed Reviewer's Report

Strength of the study:

- The topic is relevant and addresses an important public health issue
- The review integrates modern psychological concepts with Ayurvedic principles
- Literature has been collected from reliable scientific and institutional sources
- The manuscript is logically organized with clear thematic sections
- Practical preventive strategies are discussed
- The discussion is informative and balanced
- The conclusions are consistent with the objectives of the review

Weakness of the study:

- Ethical approval is not applicable but this should be clearly stated
- The review methodology lacks detailed search and selection criteria
- No critical appraisal of the included literature is presented
- Some statements need stronger supporting evidence
- A few grammatical and formatting errors require correction
- More recent systematic reviews could strengthen the discussion
- The proposed model requires future clinical validation

Reviewers Comments:

This review addresses a relevant and emerging topic by exploring the relationship between emotional intelligence, crime prevention, and Ayurvedic principles. The manuscript is well structured and presents an interesting integration of traditional knowledge with contemporary psychological concepts. The literature is organized logically, and the discussion provides meaningful insights into possible preventive approaches for behavioral health. Since this is a narrative review, ethical clearance is generally not required; however, the authors should clearly mention this in the manuscript. The overall writing quality is good, although minor grammatical, formatting, and language corrections are needed to improve readability. The review methodology should be described in greater detail, including the search strategy and article selection process. Some interpretations would benefit from stronger scientific evidence and additional recent references. Despite these limitations, the manuscript offers valuable perspectives and has the potential to contribute to interdisciplinary research in mental health and crime prevention.
