Detailed Reviewer's Report

This manuscript addresses a timely and important topic concerning the impact of geopolitical conflicts, climate change, and economic shocks on global food supply chains. The paper raises relevant concerns about vulnerabilities in food systems and the need for enhanced resilience strategies. However, in its current form, the manuscript requires substantial revision to meet the standards expected of a scholarly publication. The paper lacks a clear and coherent structure—sections are inconsistently numbered or unnumbered, and the flow between topics is disjointed, making it difficult for readers to follow the argument. The methodology section is brief and does not provide sufficient detail on the analytical framework, including how expert assessments were conducted, the basis for scenario selection, or the specific application of SWOT analysis to generate findings. The results section reads more as a literature review than an empirical presentation of findings; there are no original data, case study analyses, or clear evidence generated by the author's own research. The conclusion is disconnected from the preceding analysis and offers broad policy recommendations without adequate grounding in the evidence presented. The references are incomplete, inconsistently formatted, and include sources that are not cited properly or have missing publication details. The manuscript would benefit from a more focused research question, clearer articulation of its original contribution, strengthened analytical rigor, and thorough revision of referencing. With substantial restructuring and development, this paper could make a valuable contribution to the discourse on food security.
